	Please read the instructions carefully. Applications and supporting documents must <u>not</u> be submitted separately.		
1. Application on the prescribed application form*	The application must be signed by the applicant before a Commissioner of Oaths in South Africa (or at an SA embassy abroad) who must verify that the applicant has read and understands the examination rules. <i>*If an application is transferred to the next year, then a new updated application form must be submitted.</i>		
2. Administration fee (non-refundable, non-transferable – see rule 2.2)	R678,00 Proof of payment		

3. Examination fee (including admin fee) (non-refundable; transferable once – see rule 2.3)	R44 961,00 Proof of payment		
4. A clear original passport / ID photograph	Write your name on the back of the photograph and staple it to the front of the application form; OR A photograph with your ID document / passport held up next to your face.		
5. Certified true copies of veterinary qualification certificates	Certified, true copies of certificates and/or qualifications, translated into English. (Originals must be provided on the day of the first examination to confirm authenticity.)		
6. Assessment of qualifications	Full curricula may be requested (see rule 2.6) Submission of curricula does not automatically guarantee a place in the examination.		
7. A certificate of good standing* <i>[This requirement does not apply to persons authorised with the SAVC.]</i>	The certificate of good standing must be issued within the last three (3) months (see rule 2.7 for detail). *If an application is transferred to the next year then a new updated certificate of good standing must be submitted.		
8. A police clearance certificate*	The police clearance certificate must not be older than three (3) months and must be from the country where the applicant resides. The certificate must confirm the individual's criminal status. *If an application is transferred to the next year then a new updated police clearance certificate must be submitted.		

9. Certified proof of identity i.e. passport/ID	The original passport/identity document must be provided on the first day of the examination.		
10. Certified copy of applicant's legal permit i.e. work, study or other legal entry visa (see rule 2.10)	For non-South African residents. (The entry permit must be provided on the first day of the examination.)		
11. Proof of proficiency in English (TOEFL)	Proficiency in English Either: Successful completion (83/120) of the TOEFL (Test of English as a First Language) / IELTS (International English Language Testing System) (6) OR Proof that the language of instruction for veterinary training was in English.		
12. SA Qualifications Authority (SAQA) verification of qualification/s	A foreign qualification verification certificate from the SA Qualifications Authority (SAQA) should be submitted.
